Each year, CMP's qualified contractors prune and remove trees along thousands of miles of public roads to provide its customers with reliable electricity delivery service. With over 23,000 miles of lines keeping trees properly trimmed is a responsibility they take seriously. CMP works hard to educate the public to follow the 50/50 rule by planting trees that grow to 50 feet tall, more than 50 feet away from power lines. This year they gave each 4th grade student at the Lura Libby School a fir tree for them to plant, encouraging everyone to follow the 50/50 rule.




Maine Author, Josh Alves
